RUTH OKEDIJI is the Jeremiah Smith Jr. Professor of Law at Harvard Law School and co-director of the Berkman Klein Center for Internet and Society. She teaches contract, patent, copyright and international intellectual property law, as well as courses in biblical law.

Professor Okediji has advised many intergovernmental organizations and national governments on TRIPS implementation and compliance. She is widely cited for her research and scholarship on intellectual property law and its impact on human development, including access medicines. Her next book, *Traditional Knowledge and Modern Justice*, is forthcoming in 2023.

Professor Okediji was co-chair of the United States National Academies' Board on Science, Technology and Policy Committee on the Impact of Copyright Policy on Innovation in the Digital Era. In 2015, she was appointed to the United Nations High-Level Panel on Access to Medicines, and was named one of the world's 50 most influential people in intellectual property law by *Managing IP*.

Over the course of her career, Professor Okediji has been recognized with numerous teaching and service awards, including the Harvard Law School's Women's Law Association Shatter the Ceiling Award and the Public Knowledge IP3 Award. She is a graduate of Harvard Law School and the University of Jos.
