JOANNA BALTES is an adjunct professor for the M.S. Cybersecurity Policy and Governance Program and a member of the Business Advisory Council for the Cyber and National Security Programs at Boston College's Woods College. Joanna is a former federal prosecutor at the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) having served as an assistant United States attorney for the Southern District of California, trial attorney for the counterterrorism section, detailed trial counsel to the Office of Military Commissions in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba for the 9/11 and USS Cole prosecutions, and counsel to the assistant attorney general for national security. Her final position with the DOJ was as chief of staff to the FBI deputy director. After leaving government service, Joanna was elected to two consecutive terms as president of a K-12 school board and coached for a USA Swimming club.

Joanna lives in Northern Virginia with her husband of 22 years and their teenage sons. She received her B.A. in history from the University of Arizona and her J.D. and LL.M. in taxation from the University of San Diego School of Law, and clerked for the United States Tax Court in Washington, D.C.
