RENÉE M. LANDERS is Professor of Law at Suffolk University Law School and Faculty Director of the Health and Biomedical Law Concentration and the Master of Science in Law Life Sciences program. A former Distinguished Visiting Fellow at the National Academy of Social Insurance, she was a member of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine committee that examined ways to improve equity in the organ transplantation system. Landers has written on health law, constitutional law, diversity in the legal profession, and privacy and comments regularly for news media. Previously, she worked in private practice and was Deputy General Counsel, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and Deputy Assistant Attorney General, U.S. Department of Justice.

Landers has chaired the boards of numerous civic and educational institutions and currently is a Trustee of the Massachusetts General Hospital. A past Chair of the American Bar Association Section of Administrative Law and Regulatory Practice, she was the first woman of color and the first law professor to serve as President of the Boston Bar Association.
